University nuhelot'ine thaiyots'i nistameyimakanak Blue Quills (UnBQ) is seeking dynamic, engaging, and knowledgeable presenters for the 2019 Indigenous Thought Conference to take place on campus at St. Paul, AB.

The conference focuses on Indigenous thought and being. It is about celebrating Indigenous people's reclamation of their own systems and knowledge, and the Indigenous thought regarding present day relationships and **Indigenous social work practice.**

Audiences: people interested in; social work, human services, Indigenous healing, education, social justice, and academic researchers.

Themes:

- Indigenous world-view;
- Relationships with all things;
- Effects of colonization (and resulting lateral violence);
- Decolonizing the mind and developing respectful relationships;
- Traditional and cultural knowledge towards strong self-identity.

miyomahcihowin – **Health and Well-Being** - hotié eghenay xel suwéts'eghenay Indigenous perspectives on Health and Well-Being.

kiskinwahamâtowin – **Education** - *halonelten*Best practices on social work education; traditional epistemology, and the significance of ceremony and land based programs.

mînastâwîn- **Social Justice-** *tát'u eltth'I dene xel hoʔqi* Righting a wrong; restoring a truth.

Interweaving all the above themes is iyiniw isihcikewin – Ceremony, Culture, and Ways of Being. Opportunity will be provided to bring forward Indigenous knowledge holders to present.
